

**WORKSHOP MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF
THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO ON APRIL 18, 2006
AT 7:30 PM IN THE LAKE COMO MEETING ROOM**

Mayor Chiaravallo called the workshop meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

Mrs. Mekosh said Verizon has applied for a consent application. Mr. Gill asked if he and representative could come before the Mayor and Council just informal to answer any questions. The hearing is set for June 20, 2006. John Seliga spoke and introduced Mr. Gill, Franchise Manager. Link Janus, Franchise Manager, Nicholas Holland, outside Council. Catrina Waders, outside Council.

Darian Gill talked about Verizon provider. They are not taking over our regular cable but an added provider.

Councilman Ryan asked questions about new generation of tele communications technology. If they come in and wire our town how soon would they provide the service. Mr. Gill said within one year of approval of the public utilities.

Mr. Ryan asked if other legislation is going on in Washington on a national level.

Mr. Holland said there are bills being considered in Congress.

Councilman Witte wanted to know how the service compared to Cable Vision, price wise, station wise.

Mr. Gill explained if the people want the different fiber optic they can have it. He believes it will be \$12.95 per month for basic. Expanded would be \$39.95 per month.

Councilman Brower wanted to know if Verizon knows Cablevision prices. Mr. Gill said they are comparative but if Cablevision changes their prices that Verizon would be competitive and change their numbers.

Mrs. Mekosh wanted to know if we will be competitive with other municipalities.

Mr. Gill said we need to consent to the service first then take it from there. We are here to compete not replace.

Councilman Witte discussed DOT, DOT made some recommendations governing North Blvd. Have to put in an ordinance governing the right and left turn from North Blvd. Chief is putting

together an ordinance along with Mrs. Mekosh and ordinance to govern that. Two letters received.

Also discussed through streets. It must go to DOT for final approval. After we do this it has to go to DOT for final approval. DOT records do not have any of our streets as through streets.

Councilman Wilton talked to the County and some of the road at the butterfly garden belongs to the County some to Spring Lake.

Councilman Witte said we will prepare an ordinance for the next meeting. This is a way of doing some housekeeping.

Councilman Ryan wanted to know if there was any way to reduce the problem on 17th during the summer months. Councilman Witte said the traffic committee will take a look at it. He will mention it to the Chief. They did not want to make it a one way. Handed out some bullets on permit parking. It will not please everyone. If you do it by number of people or number of cars. Will be on Redmond Ave. and White Street all year round. Proposed 1 permit for each car with proof. Registration. If you are a rental property only the people on the co will get permits. It will not solve the problem completely. White St. And Redmond are the worst streets in town. Almost every house on that street does not have driveways. If everyone agrees with this it will get turned over to the Borough Administrator/Borough Clerk and they can make it into an ordinance and pass it on to Gallagher for his review. It may not work, we may have to revise it. Councilman Wilton would like to look at it further.

Councilman Brower does not like the idea of giving out permits to every name that is on the co. If someone is living there year round could not have a parking space even if they have a permit.

Number eight can say renter instead of summer renter. We can draw it up and Brian and Bill can make changes and we will discuss it at the next meeting. Councilwoman wants to know if you have a different last name and you are visiting your family what do you do. Councilman Wilton wants to know if there is a time limit for someone who does not have a permit. Borough Attorney William Gallagher said you can put it in the Ordinance about deliveries.

Mrs. Mekosh said she emailed someone from Rutgers to discuss the Main St. Committee.

Councilman Witte made a motion to close the public portion of the workshop, seconded by Councilman Brower. All Ayes

Mr. Ryan introduced Mr. Douglas Jones, Mr. Jones said he was not only a resident of the town but also the Associate Dean for the Rutgers Business School. He introduced one of his programs. His students go to different towns. He introduced Paul Bellview who is the program director of Rutgers Business School program. They have worked with towns throughout the state. Township programs work well they did Bellview and they are finishing Medford. Rutgers prepared an economic development program for them. The students did a wonderful job. They had to find out from the residents and visitors why they were there, what brought them in and what kinds of things would bring them in, in the future. They canvassed the local businesses. They helped Medford with their permitting, it is technology driven.

They have six to seven months for the project, the students put together a survey and the Council approves it. The fees for non profit organization is \$6,000.00 for the project and out of pocket expenses the students might incur. They run three to five hundred dollars. This for mileage cost and such. That is paid directly to the student from the client. The students and the client create a letter of engagement. First piece is mutual determination of the problem to be solved. Second is mutual determination of the approach to be taken to solve it. Third is what are the deliverables, what do you get at the end of the project. Once you have those three pieces in place you put time lines against it and a budget against it. Students are typically 28 to 30 years old and have 6 to 8 years practical experience under their belts. They are working full time and have families. Councilman Wilton wanted to know if we were limited to certain choices that are available. Mr. Jones said no it was our choice. We need to tell them what we want worked on. Enrollment is three times a year. The next cycle is the third week of May. He has one opening in this summer cycle. We would then have to wait for the next cycle.

Borough Attorney Gallagher asked about the time frame. When is the earliest we could get a report back. Mr. Jones said if we start in May we would get a response back in mid July.

Mayor suggested the Council get together and discuss it.

Councilman Ryan made a motion to close the workshop, seconded by Councilman Wilton. All Ayes.

PUBLIC WORKS: Councilman Wolfe. Absent no report.

TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE, WEB PAGE, CALENDAR, SPECIAL EVENTS:

Councilman Ryan. Fran Metsker notified Councilman Ryan there will be a meeting April 26 on Recycling. Letter from Freeholder Clifton about Alcohol & Drug abuse. The Mayor got the letter and turned it over to Captain Hope to work on it.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS: Councilman Wilton, spoke to the owners of Sunrise Market about putting up a sign and flowers. They will get back to him.. Commented on a letter from Birdsall Engineering. There may be some money available from DOT to get roads fixed. He would like the Council to consider applying for Grant money Birdsall needs to know by May 15.

BOARD OF EDUCATION, WATER AND SEWER Councilwoman McFadden-Lee - will help Ronell Giresi with the planters and the Gazebo. School Board elections were today. Next week the hydrants will be flushed. 11 pm to 7 am.

POLICE LIAISON: Councilman Witte. Did not get a report from the Chief of Police and he is absent. Matters in order.

MAYOR - Mayor passed out paperwork to the Council. Spoke of a meeting he had with Mr. Birdsall, Mr. Ryan, Mrs. Mekosh and Mrs. Graham. Mayor went along with what Mr. Birdsall who said we should have a moratorium for 3 months on the building. Mayor said he believes the moratorium is illegal and asked Borough Council William Gallagher to comment on it. He said he would have to check on it. There are different kinds of moratoriums. Mayor said Wall did this a few years back and were sewed by Builders and Wall lost. Mr. Gallagher said we are trying to control what the general design looks like. 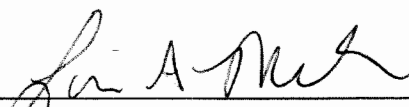

Mayor Chiaravallo asked Councilman Wilton if anyone has contacted the County about Ordinance 2006-768. At the last meeting Councilman Wilton offered the Ordinance for introduction because Councilman Witte was late for the meeting and he said this Ordinance came from the Traffic Committee. We have an Ordinance on the books now, One hour parking on all streets. We are just updating what is on the books. Mrs. Mekosh said it is 8 am to 6 pm on Saturday and Sunday. Councilman Witte said we need to do it all week.

Councilman Wilton made a motion to hold this ordinance until it is approved from the County. Copys will be sent to the County Engineer and the State DOT, seconded by Councilman Ryan.

Councilman Ryan made a motion to open the Ordinance to the public, seconded by Councilman Witte. All Ayes

Ed Fischel 1623 Main St. Wants to know how they came up with this two hour Ordinance. He has tenants and wants to know where they are supposed to park. His tenants work night and would be home all day. Councilman Witte explained we have new businesses coming into town and the people and the businesses need places to park. Discussion followed.

Dr. Joseph Louro, the new condos have off street parking. Most towns at the Shore there is a 2 hour parking limit. Had brought up about 3 years ago one side of Main St. have diagonal parking and parallel parking on the other side of Main. Retail three thousand feet or less does not have to do parking. Mayor Chiaravallo said we approached the County about diagonal parking and they said we would loose parking spaces.

Mayor Chiaravallo excused Borough Clerk Louise A. Mekosh to go to do the Board of Education election results.

Mel Hood 1604 Main St. Mr. Hood asked if the Council got his letter. Mayor Chiaravallo said yes he did and would have read it if Mr. Hood had not shown up. Mr. Ryan wanted to know why the Council did not get a copy. Deputy Borough Clerk Georgine Young explained that the letter came in after the cut off date for the meeting. Mr. Rvan asked for an executive meeting

after the regular meeting to discuss this. Mayor Chiaravallo asked if the letter could be read. Mr. Ryan said he did not think it should be read. Mrs. Young explained that the letter came in after the cut off date and that Mr. Hood was told it would not be on the agenda. Mr. Hood read the letter. Wants to know the Council's comments on metered parking. He has a business on Main Street that would be effected.

Councilwoman McFadden-Lee said she thinks metered parking is a good suggestion. Mayor said it was brought up on North Blvd. and the Council rejected it.

Councilman Brower said it would be the same for two hour parking. Someone will have to mark the tires.

Nancy Fischel 1623 Main St. what about the people who drive to work where are they going to park.

Dr. Louro 1717 Main St. wants to know about the ordinance we have already. Council said it is only effective Saturday and Sunday. Mayor said we are waiting for County approval. Mr. Ryan said if the County approves this Ordinance it would come back to the Mayor and Council and open to the public again for discussion. Discussion followed. Councilman Ryan said this is why Councilman Witte has had meetings with the traffic committee.

Councilman Wilton made a motion to carry this till the next meeting, seconded by Councilman Ryan, and approved with the following vote. "Ayes" Witte, Wilton, McFadden-Lee, Brower and Ryan.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Councilman Ryan made a motion to open the meeting for public comment, seconded by Councilman Wilton. All Ayes.

Bob Kirk 526 North Blvd. School budget was defeated which means the School Board will have to meet with the Mayor and Council to discuss a new budget. Mr. Kirk will be calling Freehold tomorrow. There is a set number of days from the defeat of the budget to when they have to meet, he will find out and let everyone know.

Councilwoman McFadden-Lee made a motion to close the public portion of the meeting, seconded by Councilman Wilton. All Ayes.

Mayor Chiaravallo made note the Youth Government will be meeting on May 4 and on May 16 they will be meeting as the Borough Council. The Mayor said the County came in twice for blood pressure screening and no one showed up except the Borough staff. He may not continue it. Councilman Witte wants it on a Saturday or at night. Mayor will look into it.
