### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

- Councilwoman Albala-Doyle reported that all matters are in order.
- Councilman Ventrice reported that the presentation that was given to the Environmental Commission from the Williamsburg High School of Architecture and Design focuses on the streets and the pathway to the lake would be good to bring up in conjunction with the ongoing traffic study. Councilman Ventrice suggested that the WHSAD do their

presentation to the Council in the near future. All other matters are in order.

- Councilman DeMauro reported that all matters are in order.
- Councilman D'Antuono reported that the Improvements to 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Newman Street Project is going out to bid with the opening being held on October 13<sup>th</sup> at 10am. Councilman D'Antuono reported that the Energy Co-op that Lake Como is a part of will be ending November 30<sup>th</sup> as the program was unable to obtain favorable pricing for energy costs. The coop will be attempting to obtain favorable pricing for the next round of the program which will begin in March of 2022.
  - Mayor Higgins asked if the company can obtain favorable pricing and begin again, will residents have to opt-out again or will that roll over? Councilman D'Antuono stated he will look into that and report out when he has an answer.
- Councilwoman Scull thanked everyone who made this Lake Como Day a success, including the planning committee, Tourism, Frankie & Tony Jones, DPW, the police and the ACHS students that volunteered their time. The September Business of the Month was Coaster Life on 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Main Street. All other matters are in order.
- Councilman Witte reported that all matters are in order.
- Mayor Higgins echoed Councilwoman Scull's comments and thanked her for stepping up to the plate for Lake Como Day. Mayor Higgins reported that the traffic study committee will be himself, along with Councilman Witte, Councilman DeMauro and Councilwoman Albala-Doyle and this will be discussed again at a future workshop meeting. All other matters are in order.
  - Kevin Lynch, SMRSA representative came before the council and stated that there will be a budget meeting on October 14<sup>th</sup> and there is a projected 2.3% increase in the SMRSA 2022 budget. Mr. Lynch reported that he is hoping to meet with the engineers about continuing the I&I project because about 1/3 of the water being treated is clean water. The amount of rain we have definitely impacts our numbers. Councilman Witte asked how much of an increase 2.3% is and Mr. Lynch responded that it is between \$20,000-\$30,000.
