Extension of Premises Application

Fahey Hospitality dba Joe's Surf Shack

- Bob Fahey, owner of Joe's Surf Shack came before the Council with his plans for the parking lot of his establishment the day of the Belmar/Lake Como St. Patrick's Day Parade. Mr. Fahey stated that there will be a complimentary breakfast for the marchers and firefighters, he anticipates that the crowds will gather from about 12pm-5pm under the tents in the parking lot. The tents will be there for protection from the weather if it rains, there will not be sides on the tents. Mr. Fahey stated that there will be hi-top tables, porta potties and no cover charge for locals. He will fence off the parking lot and have a single entrance and exit with 15-20 security guys. There will be a band beginning at 2pm inside.
- Captain Cox stated that Mr. Fahey made a request to have an officer and if one is available he will have that request filled otherwise there will be roving officers that day. Capt. Cox stated that Mr. Fahey knows to monitor the line and if it gets unruly he knows to reach out.
- Mr. Fahey stated he has reached out to Fire Marshall Ryan Dullea for occupancy for the tented area.
- Captain Cox asked Mr. Fahey if there will be cars in the lot, he responded that there will not be. As long as he gets the occupancy from Ryan and that there is no cooking outside, he does not have an issue with this.

- Mayor Higgins asked Mr. Marroquin to wait until the next meeting but in the meantime, work to get approval for having the heaters in the back.
