DATE: JULY 16, 2019 7:30 PM WORKSHOP

DISCUSSION ITEMS

- 1. Presentation on the Trap, Neuter, Release Program by the Monmouth County SPCA.
 - a. Mayor Higgins began the discussion for the Trap, Neuter, Release Program to deal with the ongoing feral cat situation. Mayor Higgins stated that the MCSPCA came to one of the Coffee with the Mayor meetings and he thought the information was important to bring to the Council and the residents of Lake Como.
 - b. Scott Crawford from the Monmouth County SPCA came before the Council and thanked Lake Como for entering into the Trap, Neuter, Release (TNR) Program. How the TNR program works is, residents call in problem areas and those areas are targeted. Mr. Crawford stated that when the cats are trapped, adoptable cats are kept, older ones are returned to the wild because it is cruel to keeo the feral cats in cages. The cats are spayed and neutered, vaccinated against rabies and released. Mr. Crawford reported that so far, 30 adult cats have been done and 18 kittens have been kept for adoption.
 - c. Mayor Higgins asked, what about residents that feed the feral cats. Mr. Crawford responded that the SPCA has educated the colony caretakers and residents in charge of taking care of the colonies and there are limited feeding hours.
 - d. Councilman Gardner asked Mr. Crawford if the cats are microchipped and Mr. Crawford responded that they are chipped so they are returned to the proper colony if they are trapped.
 - e. Councilwoman Kropac asked if this program has been successful. Mr. Crawford responded that Briarwood Terrace has been the hotspot for complaints on feral cats and it has been very successful.
 - f. Mayor Higgins thanked Mr. Crawford for coming to the meeting and reported that we will be updating our ordinance and would appreciate his input and moving forward, asked Mr. Crawford to forward recommendations to the Borough Clerk/Administrator Louise Mekosh.

2. Bamboo Ordinance Discussion

- a. Mayor Higgins began this discussion by stating that other towns have been passing bamboo ordinances because it is a very invasive species. In one instance in town, a homeowner cut and stored bamboo, the wind blew it and it seeded all over the neighborhood. Mayor Higgins asked Councilman Gardner if he could look into other bamboo ordinances. Councilman Gardner stated that our proposed bamboo ordinance is almost the exact wording as the one Belmar has and he will reach out to them on their success rate.
- b. Councilman Witte asked if the ordinance contains who is responsible for removing bamboo since his yard is overrun with bamboo that spread from a neighbor's yard and if the ordinance will require residents with bamboo to make sure it doesn't spread. Mayor Higgins asked if there will be definition on how to get rid of the bamboo. Councilman Gardner stated he would like to hear from residents on this and Mayor Higgins stated that this discussion will be continued at the next workshop meeting.

RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE FORM AND OTHER DETAILS OF NOT EXCEEDING \$2,965,000 WATER UTILITY BONDS, SERIES 2019 OF THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR SALE TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (THE "USDA") PURSUANT TO THE USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT LOAN PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Borough of Lake Como (the "Borough"), in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Borough to finance the cost of the various water system improvements in the Borough (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined to finance the Project with the proceeds of a loan (the "Loan") to be made to the Borough by the United States Department of Agriculture (the "USDA") in connection with the Rural Development Loan Program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loan, the USDA requires the Borough to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Borough's not to exceed \$2,965,000 Water Utility Bonds, Series 2019 (the "Bonds") in accordance with the provisions hereof and pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law") and other applicable law; and

WHEREAS, section 27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Bonds to the USDA without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO. IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2), the Borough hereby sells and awards the Borough's not to exceed \$2,965,000 Water Utility Bonds (the "Bonds") to the USDA in accordance with the provisions hereof. The Bonds have been referred to and described in bond ordinance number 2016-908 finally adopted on September 6, 2016, as amended by bond ordinance number 2018-932 finally adopted on March 27, 2018, each duly approved and published as required by law, at which meetings a quorum was present and acting throughout, all pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law.

Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer") is hereby authorized and directed to determine, in accordance with the Local Bond Law and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the USDA and the terms and conditions hereof, the following items with respect to the Bonds:

- (a) The aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued, provided that the total amount of Bonds issued shall not exceed the aggregate principal amount of \$2,965,000;
- (b) The maturity and principal installments of the Bonds, which maturity shall not exceed 40 years;
- (d) The date of the Bonds;
- (e) The interest rates of the Bonds;
- (f) The purchase price of the Bonds; and
- (g) The terms and conditions under which the Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities.

Section 3. Any determination made by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms hereof shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation of the Bonds by the parties authorized under Section 4(c) hereof.

Section 4. The Borough Council hereby determines that certain terms of the Bonds shall be as follows:

- (a) The Bonds shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered WU-1;
- (b) The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owners thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
- (d) The Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor of the Borough (the "Mayor") and the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough under official seal of the Borough or facsimile thereof affixed, printed, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the Borough (the "Deputy Clerk").

Section 5. The Bonds shall be substantially in the form set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto with such additions, deletions and omissions as may be necessary for the Borough to comply with the requirements of the Program, upon the advice of Bond Counsel to the Borough (as hereinafter defined);

Section 6. The law firm of Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Woodbridge, New Jersey, Bond Counsel to the Borough ("Bond Counsel"), CME Associates, Parlin, New Jersey, the Borough Engineer ("Borough Engineer"), Shain Schaffer, Bernardsville, New Jersey, the Borough Attorney ("Borough Attorney") and Holman Frenia & Allison, P.C., Freehold, New Jersey, the Borough Auditor ("Borough Auditor") are each hereby authorized and directed to perform all actions necessary to consummate the issuance of the Bonds and the Project for which the Bonds are issued, including but not limited to. drafting and arranging for the printing and execution of the Bonds and all applicable documentation necessary to memorialize and consummate the issuance of the Bonds and the undertaking of the Project, preparing all necessary financial information, all engineering and design work, preparation of plans and specifications and conducting all necessary studies, searches and analysis in connection with the issuance of the Bonds and the undertaking of the Project. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer, Clerk and/or Deputy Clerk are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any certificates, documents, and, agreements necessary or desirable in connection with the financial and other information of the Borough.

Section 7. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Clerk and/or Deputy Clerk and any other Borough representative, are each hereby authorized and directed to (i) execute any certificates or documents necessary or desirable in connection with the sale of the Bonds or the undertaking of the Project and each are hereby further authorized and directed to deliver same to the USDA upon delivery of the Bonds and the receipt of payment therefor or in accordance with the Program and (ii) perform such other actions as they deem necessary, desirable or convenient, in consultation with Bond Counsel, in relation to the execution and delivery thereof (including making any changes necessary to this resolution that are deemed necessary and advisable, all in consultation with Bond Counsel).

Section 8. Upon the adoption hereof, the Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to Everett M. Johnson, Esq., at Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Bond Counsel to the Borough.

Section 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
