RESOLUTION NO. 2019-138

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF THE FRANCHISE
AGREEMENT WITH NEW JERSEY NATURAL GAS COMPANY**

WHEREAS, New Jersey Natural Gas Company ("NJNG") has heretofore been granted a franchise and consent to lay, maintain and operate gas facilities in the Borough of Lake Como (formerly the Borough of South Belmar); and

WHEREAS, NJNG is desirous of obtaining a franchise and consent of the municipality to continue serving the municipality.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Lake Como hereby consents and authorizes NJNG to lay, maintain and operate for a period of twenty-five (25) years from the date hereof, its conductors, mains and pipes together with all appurtenances thereto, in, under and over all the public streets, alleys, squares and public places in the Borough of Lake Como for the purpose of conducting, transmitting and distributing gas or any mixture of gases of various types, including natural gas, upon the following terms and conditions and rules, regulations and ordinances of the Borough of Lake Como:

1. That NJNG shall agree that, in all cases in which street openings or excavations are made for the purposes aforesaid, the pavement and the surface of the streets, alleys, squares or roadways shall be reasonably restored by New Jersey Natural Gas Company to the same condition as existed prior to the opening thereof; and
2. That NJNG shall conduct the work or the laying or maintaining of gas pipes therein in a careful and prudent manner; and
3. That NJNG shall safeguard the public interest in continuous and uninterrupted service during the term of the grant; and
4. That NJNG shall maintain its property in good order throughout the full term of the grant; and
5. That NJNG shall defend and indemnify and hold harmless the Borough of Lake Como from any liability arising from the operations of NJNG, to the extent caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of NJNG or its employees or agents; and
6. That NJNG shall continuously afford safe, adequate and proper service at just and reasonable rates as determined by the Board of Public Utilities of the State of New Jersey.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this franchise consent, upon approval of the Board of Public Utilities of the State of New Jersey, shall supersede the Resolution granted by the Borough of South Belmar on March 18, 1969; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall file with the clerk of this municipality within sixty (60) days from the date hereof, its acceptance of the terms and provisions of the franchise consent herein granted and its agreement to be bound by the terms and provisions

thereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall not become effective unless and until it is approved by the Board of Public Utilities of the State of New Jersey.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-945

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL CLERK TO MAINTAIN
A LIST OF RESIDENTS IN NEED OF SPECIAL ASSISTANCE IN CASE OF
EMERGENCY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY PURPOSES.**

BE IT ORDAINED that P.L. 2017, c.266, permits municipalities to establish a list of residents identifying themselves as needing special assistance in an emergency.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED THAT this ordinance will require the municipal clerk to maintain a list of residents identifying themselves as in need of special assistance in the event of an emergency. The list shall be cross-indexed by the name and address of each resident that opts onto the list, identifying the special circumstances for each, and is to be used solely for public safety purposes. The clerk shall provide the list, which must be updated at least monthly, to the municipality's police department as well as the fire department and first aid squad serving the municipality. This list is exempt from disclosure under the Open Public Records Act (N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 et seq.).

BE IT ORDAINED THAT each year the Municipal Clerk will include with the mailing of the annual tax bill a notice advising residents that such a list is being maintained for public safety purposes. This notice shall include information as to how municipal residents may add their names and addresses onto the list. The municipal clerk shall provide a copy of the notice to each rental certificate of occupancy to notify each landlord of the existence of the list, and provide the landlord with a copy of the notice to be forwarded on to the landlord's tenants; the landlord shall forward this notice to their tenants within 30 days of any rental agreements. Thereafter, upon creation of a tenancy, a landlord shall advise each tenant of the special assistance list how they may add themselves to the list.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication.

**BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF
THE SOUTH BELMAR FIRST AID PROPERTY LOCATED
AT 703 18TH AVENUE, DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 31, LOT
25, BY AND IN THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO, IN THE
COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY;
APPROPRIATING \$450,000 THEREFOR AND
AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$428,500 BONDS OR
NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE
COST THEREOF**

WHEREAS, the Borough Council instituted a lawsuit in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Chancery Division, Monmouth County, captioned Borough of Lake Como v. South Belmar First Aid, Docket No. C-76-18 (the "Litigation") against the South Belmar First Aid Squad ("SBFAS") seeking, inter alia, a declaratory judgment vesting the Borough of Lake Como, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") with title to a portion of 703 18th Avenue, Block 31, Lot 25, in the Borough (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2019, the Honorable Katie A. Gummer, P.J.Ch., entered a Consent Judgment in the Litigation providing, inter alia, that SBFAS had the option to purchase the Borough's interest in the Property and, if they were unable or declined to purchase the Borough's interest, the Borough could purchase SBFAS' interest for \$420,000.00; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Contract of Sale (the "Contract") executed by the Borough and SBFAS, if SBFAS was unable to obtain satisfactory financing within sixty (60) days after execution of the Contract they could cancel upon ten (10) days' written notice to Counsel for the Borough; and

WHEREAS, on September 18, 2019, SBFAS notified Counsel of its intention to cancel; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council believes it is in the best interest of Lake Como residents that it obtain full title of the Property.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement or purpose to be undertaken by the Borough of Lake Como, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$450,000, said amount being inclusive of \$21,500 as the amount of down payment for said improvements or purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). The down payment is now available by virtue of a provision or provisions in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof, and to meet part of said \$450,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$428,500 pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$428,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are for the purchase of the South Belmar First Aid Property and the payment of the purchase price for the property, a lawful public purpose, designated as Block 31, Lot 25, located at 703 18th Avenue, as referenced on the Official Tax Map of the Borough (the "Property"), including any structures, buildings, improvements, personal property, fixtures, easements, rights-of-way or other property rights currently located thereon..

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$428,500.

(c) The estimated cost of said improvement or purpose is \$450,000, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, being the amount of \$21,500, is comprised of the down payment for said improvement or purpose.

SECTION 4. In the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Monmouth make a contribution or grant in aid to the Borough for the improvement and purpose authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Borough *prior* to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Monmouth. In the event, however, that any amount so contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Monmouth shall be received by the Borough after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so issued

and shall be used for no other purpose. This Section 4 shall not apply, however, with respect to any contribution or grant in aid received by the Borough as a result of using funds from this bond ordinance as "matching local funds" to receive such contribution or grant in aid.

SECTION 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital budget of the Borough is

hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance, and to the extent of any inconsistency herewith, a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, will be on file in the office of the Clerk and will be available for public inspection.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is an improvement which the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been, or shall be, specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of said improvements within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$428,500, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$30,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement herein before described.

SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 9. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. This Section 9 is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Borough's official intent to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulations §1.150-2. All reimbursement allocations will occur not later than eighteen (18) months after the later of (i) the date the expenditure from a source other than any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance is paid, or (ii) the date the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof is "placed in service" (within the meaning of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2) or abandoned, but in no event more than three (3) years after the expenditure is paid.

SECTION 10. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Code of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this bond ordinance.

SECTION 11. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough, which are authorized herein, and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough, which are authorized herein, and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 12. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO
AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF LANDS KNOWN
AS LOT 25, BLOCK 31 FROM THE SOUTH BELMAR FIRST AID SQUAD**

WHEREAS, pursuant to a Court Order entered by The Honorable Katie A. Gummer, P.J.Ch., on June 21, 2019, the Borough has the option to purchase the interest of The South Belmar First Aid Squad ("SBFAS") in premises known as Block 31, Lot 25 (the "Property") after SBFAS declined to exercise its option to purchase the Property from the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Lake Como believe it to be in the best interest of the citizens of Lake Como to acquire the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Property appraised by an independent third-party appraiser who determined that the interest of the SBFAS is valued at \$420,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer has conducted an environmental inspection of the property and hereby recommends acquisition of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough has verified that financing can be made available through Bond Anticipation Notes to pay for the aforesaid acquisition; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance authorizing the Bond Anticipation Notes is being introduced simultaneously herewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Lake Como, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor, Borough Clerk and Borough Attorney are hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all documents as are reasonably necessary to acquire fee simple title to the portion of the Property currently owned by the SBFAS, including all improvements erected on, over and beneath aforesaid lands to be acquired; and all easements, rights-of-way or uses, privileges, licenses, hereditaments, appurtenances, interests and other rights belonging to or inuring to the benefit of the lands to be acquired and all right, title and interest of the owners in and to any land lying in the bed of any highway, street, road or avenue, opened or proposed, in front or abutting or adjoining aforesaid lands to be acquired.

Section 2. The purchase price for the portion of the Property to be acquired shall be Four Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$420,000.00), consistent with the appraisal performed by Gagliano & Company, Real Estate Advisory Services.

Section 3. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to accept the Deed transferring the SBFAS portion of the Property to the Borough, provided the Deed is in a form satisfactory to the Borough Attorney.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. If any section, subdivision, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as provided by law.
