ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 3 SECTION 25.3 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "PARKING OF BUSES AND TRUCKS", and CHAPTER 7, SECTION 15 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "PARKING OF VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF FOUR TONS PROHIBITED"

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Lake Como, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"), a public body corporate and politic of State of New Jersey ("the State"), wish to amend and supplement the ordinance prohibiting parking of certain trucks, vehicles and trailers for greater clarity to the Borough and its residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake Como, Chapter 3 Section 25.3 is hereby amended and supplemented as follows (additions in [brackets]; deletions stuck through):

§3-25.3 PARKING OF BUSES AND TRUCKS.

There shall be no parking of any of the following vehicles on the public streets or any parts thereof or any public property within the Borough of Lake Como during the hours of 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.:

- a. Any commercially licensed vehicle;
- b. Any bus, omnibus, house trailer, camper, recreational vehicle, boat, boat trailer;
- c. Any box truck (which shall mean any vehicle with a separate cab and box-type structure); and
- d. Any vehicle over 10,000 pounds.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake Como, Chapter 7 Section 15 is hereby amended and supplemented as follows (additions in [brackets]; deletions struck through):

§ 7-15. PARKING OF VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF FOUR TONS PROHIBITED [CERTAIN TRUCKS, VEHICLES AND TRAILERS PROHIBITED].

No person shall park a truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or omnibus having registered gross weights in excess of four tons upon any street between the hours specified.

Section a. No person shall park any commercially licensed vehicle, a school bus, box trucks (which shall mean any vehicle with a separate cab and box-type structure) any type of bus, recreational vehicle, camper, boat or trailer, however not including six-wheel pickup trucks or trucks utilized for the purpose of making deliveries or moving furniture,

and not including any vehicle with handicap license plates or properly issued and displayed handicap placard, between the hours specified, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described.

[Section b. Further, permission may be granted by the Police Department for the temporary parking of any such trucks or vehicles during the hours when parking is prohibited as specified above and under such terms and conditions as specified by the Police Department.]

[Section c. There shall be no parking of any boat trailer or trailers at any time upon any of the public streets or parts thereof within the Borough.]

SO ORDAINED as aforesaid.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 9, SECTION 1.3 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO BY FURTHER AMENDING THE CONSTRUCTION FEE SCHEDULE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Lake Como, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1 Chapter 9 Section 1.3 "Construction Fee Schedule", be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

- a. The fees to be charged for permits issued by the Building Department under the State Uniform Construction Code shall be as provided in the Fee Schedule as set forth below. A copy of the Fee Schedule shall be maintained on file in the Building Department and in the office of the Borough Clerk.
- b. Plan review fee: The fee for plan review shall be 20 percent of the amount to be charged for a new construction permit. There shall be an additional fee of \$50.00 per hour or part thereof per subcode having assigned plan review responsibility for review of an amendment or change to a plan that has already been released. This fee may be waived at the discretion of the Construction Official in the event the work and review is of a minor nature.
- c. The basic construction fee shall be the sum of the parts computed on the basis of the volume or the cost of construction, the number of plumbing fixtures and pieces of equipment, the number of electric fixtures and devices and the number of sprinklers, standpipes and detectors (smoke and heat) at the unit rates and/or the applicable flat fees provided herein plus any special fees. The minimum fee for a basic construction permit covering any or all of building, plumbing, electric or fire protection work shall be \$85.00 per Subcode except as herein noted.
- d. All applicable fees shall be paid before a permit is issued, except that the payment of all fees shall be waived for the following:
 - 1.All work to be performed by the Monmouth County Energy Conservation Program.
 - 2. The construction, erection or alteration of any fence within a farm which is to be located more than 25 feet from any street line.
 - In the case of any construction, reconstruction, alteration or improvement designed and undertaken solely to promote accessibility by handicapped persons to an existing public or private structure or any of the facilities contained therein, the enforcing agency fee shall be waived. For purposes of this section, the phrase "handicapped person" shall have the

same meaning as is set forth in N.J.S.A. 52:27D-119 et seq., as the same may be amended and supplemented.

e. In addition to the fees charged by the municipality, a surcharge in the amount provided by N.J.A.C. 5:23-4.19 shall be charged, collected and remitted by the Building Department to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

f. Fee Schedule:

1. Building.

Building volume or cost: The fees for new construction or alteration are as follows:

- (a) Fees for new construction shall be based upon the volume of the structure. Volume shall be computed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:23-2.28. The new construction fee shall be in the amount of \$0.034 \$0.045 per cubic foot of volume for buildings and structures of all groups R-3, R-4 and R-5; \$0.40 per cubic foot of volume for buildings and structures of groups B, H, I-1, I-2, I-3, M, E, R-1, R-2 and U; \$0.023 per cubic foot of volume for buildings and structures of groups F-1, F-2, S-1 and S-2. The minimum fee shall be \$175 \$200.
- (b) Fees for reconstruction, renovations, alterations and repairs or site construction associated with pre-manufactured construction, and external utility connections for pre-manufactured construction shall be based upon the estimated cost of the work. The fee shall be in the amount of \$34.00 \$42.00 per \$1,000.00 of the estimated cost of work. From \$50,001 to and including \$100,000, the additional fee shall be in the amount of #27.00 \$36.00 per \$1,000 of the estimated cost above \$50,000. Above \$100,000, the additional fee shall be in the amount of \$23.00 \$31.00 per \$1,000 of the estimated cost above \$100,000.
- (c) For the purpose of determining the estimated cost, the applicant shall submit such data as may be available produced by the architect or engineer of record, or by a recognized estimating firm, or by the contractor. A bona fired contractor's bid, if available, shall be submitted. The Construction Official shall make the final decision regarding estimated cost.
- (d) Fees for additions shall be computed on the same basis for new construction for the added portion.
- (e) Fees for combination renovations and additions shall be computed separately in accordance with items (a) and (b) above.
- (f) The fee for tents requiring a construction permit shall be \$150.00 \$175.00.
- (g) The fee for temporary structures requiring a construction permit shall be \$100.00 \$125.00.

- (h) The fee for roofing and siding work completed on structures in use group R-3 and R-5 shall be \$95.00 per structure. All other use groups where required shall be considered renovation and calculated as per (b) above.
- (i) The fee for an above-ground swimming pool shall be \$100.00.
- (j) The fee for an in-ground swimming pool with a surface area greater than 500 square feet shall be \$250.00 \$300.00: the fee for all other cases shall be \$175.00 \$200.00.
- (k) The fee for replacing barriers surrounding and enclosing swimming pools required to have barriers shall be \$75 \\$85.00.
- (I)The fee for a permit to construct a sign shall be in the amount of \$2.50 \$2.70 per square foot of surface area of the sign, computed on one side only for a double-faced sign. The minimum fee shall be \$75.00 \$85.00.
- (m) The fee for a permit for lead hazard abatement work shall be \$161.00 \$200.00. The fee for lead abatement clearance certificate shall be \$32.00 \$45.00.
- (n) The fee for the issuance of a building permit that has not been determined shall be \$75.00 \$85.00.
- (o) The fee for a permit to move a building or structure from one lot to another or to a new location on the same lot shall be \$100.00 plus the cost of the new foundation and alterations to the building or structure for the placement in a completed condition in the new location shall be computed as required for renovations, alterations and repairs in section b.1(b).
- (p) The fee to erect a fence greater than 6 feet in height shall be \$75.00 \$85.00.
- (q) The fee for an asbestos removal permit shall be \$75.00 \$85.00.
- (r) Fees for retaining walls that require a construction permit shall be as follows:
 - (1) The fee for a retaining wall with a surface area greater than 550 square feet that is associated with a Class 3 residential structure shall be \$200.00;
 - (2) The fee for a retaining wall with a surface area of 550 square feet or less that is associated with a Class 3 residential structure shall be \$100.00;
 - (3) The fee for a retaining wall of any size that is associated with other than a Class 3 residential structure shall be in accordance with 1(b) above.
- (s) The fee for a deck accessory to a group R-3, R-4 or R-5 structure shall be \$0.40 per sq. ft., all other decks shall be calculated accordance with paragraph 1(b) above.

(t) The fee for garden utility sheds and similar structures 101 to 200 sq. ft. more than 200 square feet and accessory to group R-3, R-4 or R-5 structure that does not have a permanent footing below the frost line shall be \$75, \$85.00

2. PLUMBING

Plumbing fixtures and equipment: The fees shall be as follows:

- (a) The fee shall be \$20.00 \$25.00 per plumbing fixture and or water closet, urinal, bidet, bath tub, shower, lavatory, sink, laundry tub, floor drains, drinking fountains, residential dishwashers, garbage disposals, clothes washers, water heaters up to 99 gallons, recirculation systems, roof drains, hose bibs, air admittance valve, residential oil piping, manholes, reheat coils, condensate drains, or similar devices, except as listed below.
- (b) The fee shall be \$90.00 \$100.00 per special device for the following: grease traps, oil separators, water utility connections per every 150 lineal feet, sewer utility connections per every 150 lineal feet, commercial dishwashers, backflow preventers in other than one-and-two-family dwellings, sewer pumps, interceptors, active solar systems and, testing of waste and vents for modular homes.
- (c) For cross connections and backflow preventers that are subject to testing, requiring reinspection annually, the fee shall be \$75 \$85.00 for each device when they are tested.
- (d) The fee shall be \$75 \$85.00 for the installation of a boiler (hot water or steam) or furnace up to 250,000 BTU's.
- (e) The fee shall be \$288 \$300.00 for the installation of a boiler (hot water or steam) or furnace 250,001 BTU's and above.
- (f) The fee for Mechanical Inspections in R-3 and R-5 shall be \$85.00

- 3. **ELECTRICAL** The electrical Subcode fees shall be as follows.
- (a) For the first block of one to 25 receptacles, fixtures or devices, the fee shall be \$85.00. For each additional block consisting of up to 25 receptacles, fixtures or devices, the fee shall be \$25.00. For the purpose of computing this fee, receptacles, fixtures or devices shall include wall switches, convenience receptacles, light fixtures, exit signs, emergency lights, smoke detectors, CO detectors, heat detectors, communications points, rain sensor, CATV, intercoms, alarm devices, glass-breaks, motion sensors, keypads, light standards eight feet or less in height including luminaries, thermostats, energy management points, sensors, dimmers, or similar electric fixtures and devices rated 20 amperes or less including motors or equipment rated less than one horsepower (hp) or one kilowatt (kW).
- (b) For each motor or electrical device rated from one hp or one kW to 10 hp or 10 kW; for each transformer or generator rated from one kW or one kva to 10 kW or 10 kva; for each replacement of wiring involving one branch circuit or part thereof; for each storable pool or hydro massage bath tub; for each underwater lighting fixture; for household electric cooking equipment rated up to 16 kW; for each fire, security or burglar alarm control unit; for each receptacle rated from 30 amperes to 50 amperes; for each light-standard greater than 8 feet in height including luminaries; and for each communications closet, the fee shall be \$30.00
- (c) For each motor or electrical device rated from greater than 10 hp or 10 kW to 50 hp or 50 kW; for each service equipment, panel board, switch board, switch gear, motor-control-center, or disconnecting means rated 225 amperes or less; for each transformer or generator rated from greater than 10 kW or 10 kva to 45 kW or 45 kva; for each electric sign rated from greater than 20 amperes to 225 amperes including associated disconnecting means; for each receptacle rated greater than 50 amperes; and for each utility load management device, the fee shall be \$\frac{100}{200}\$. \$\frac{85.00}{200}\$
- (d)For each motor or electrical device rated from greater than 50 hp or 50 kW to 100 hp or 100 kW; for each service equipment, panel board, switch board, switch gear, motor-control-center or disconnecting means rated from greater than 225 amperes to 1,000 amperes; and for each transformer or generator rated from greater than 45 kW or 45 kva to 112.5 kw or 112.5 kva, the fee shall be \$74.\$185.00
- (e) For each motor or electrical device rated greater than 100 hp or 100 kW; for each service equipment, panel board, switch board, switch gear, motor-control-center or disconnecting means rated greater than 1,000 amperes; and for each transformer or generator rated greater than 112.5 kW or 112.5 kva, the fee shall be \$1550.\$800.00

- (f) The fee charged for electrical work for each permanently installed private swimming pool as defined in the building subcode, spa, hot tub or fountain shall be a flat fee of \$150 \$175 which shall include any required bonding, and associated equipment such as filter pumps, motors, disconnecting means, switches, required receptacles, and heaters, etc., excepting panelboards and underwater lighting fixtures. For public swimming pools, the fee shall be charged on the basis of the number of electrical fixtures and rating of electrical devices involved in accordance with paragraphs 3(a) through (e) above.
- (g) The fee charged for the installation of single and multiple station smoke or heat detectors and fire, burglar or security alarm systems in any one or two-family dwelling shall be a flat fee of \$55 per dwelling unit. For fire, burglar and security alarm systems and detectors in buildings other than one- or two-family dwellings, the fee shall be charged in accordance with paragraphs 3(a) through (e) above.
- (h) For installations consisting of multimeter stacks, the fee shall be based on the ampere rating of the main bus and not upon the number of meters or rating of disconnects on the meter stack. Individual loadside panel boards shall be charged in accordance with paragraphs 3 (c), (d) and (e) above. There shall be no additional fee charged for the concurrent installation of individual feeder conductors.
- (i) For motors or similar devices requiring concurrent installation of individual controls, relays and switches, the fee shall be based only upon the rating of the motor or device. There shall be no additional fee charged for the concurrent installation of individual circuit components, for example, controllers, starters, and disconnecting means.
- (j) For electrical work requiring replacement of service entrance conductors or feeder conductors only, the fee shall be based on the designated ampere rating of the overcurrent device of the service or feeder as follows:
 - (1) 225 amperes or less, the fee shall be ; \$85.00
 - (2) 226 to 1,000 amperes, the fee shall be **\$\overline{1}\$**; \$170.00 and
 - (3) Greater than 1,000 amperes, the fee shall be 3750. \$800.00
- (k) The fee charged for process equipment shall be based on the ampere rating of the overcurrent device protecting the conductor feeding the process equipment or the cutoff device.
- (I) For the purpose of computing these fees, all electrical and communications devices, utilization equipment and motors which are part of premises wiring, except those which are portable plug-in type, shall be counted.

- (m) For photovoltaic systems, the fee shall be based on the designated kilowatt rating of the solar photovoltaic system as follows:
 - (1) For the first 10 kW \$300.
 - (2) For each additional 10 kW add \$100.
- (n) The fee for the annual electrical inspection of swimming pools, spas or hot tubs shall be \$110.00

4. Fire Protection.

For fire protection and hazardous equipment, sprinklers, standpipes, detectors (smoke and heat), pre-engineered suppression systems, gas and oil fired appliances not connected to the plumbing system, kitchen exhaust systems, incinerators and crematoriums, the fee shall be as follows:

- (a) The fee for 20 or fewer heads shall be \$110.00; for 21 to and including 100 heads, the fee shall be \$200 \$210.00; for 101 to and including 200 heads, the fee shall be \$360.00; for 201 to and including 400 heads, the fee shall be \$1,000; for 401 to and including 1,000 heads, the fee shall be \$1,500; for over 1,000 heads, the fee shall be \$2,000.
- (b) The fee for one to 12 detectors shall be \$85; for each 25 detectors in addition to this, the fee shall be in the amount of \$25. \$35

- (e) The fee for each gas or oil fired appliance that is not connected to the plumbing system shall be **55.00**
- (f) The fee for each kitchen exhaust system shall be **55.00**
- (g) The fee for each incinerator shall be \$500.
- (h) The fee for each crematorium shall be \$500.
- (i) For single and multiple station smoke or heat detectors and fire alarm systems in any one- or two-family dwellings, there shall be a flat fee of \$85.00 per dwelling unit. For detectors and fire alarm systems in buildings other than one- or two-family dwellings, the fee shall be charged in accordance with paragraph 4(b) above.
- (j) All other fire protection devices, tank installs/removals, solar installations, etc. shall be charged the \$85.00 where appropriate.

5. Demolition.

The fee for a demolition or removal permit shall be \$110.00 for a structure of less than 5,000 square feet in area and less than 30 feet in height, for one- or two-family dwellings (Group R-3 or R-5 of the building subcode), structures on farms, including commercial farm buildings under N.J.A.C. 5:23-3.2(d), and \$250 for all other Groups. The fee for demolition of a fuel storage tank or septic tank accessory to a use group R-3, R-4 or R-5 structure shall be \$150.00

6. Certificates.

- (b) The fee for a certificate of occupancy granted pursuant to a change of use group shall be \$200.
- (c) The fee for a certificate of continued occupancy issued under N.J.A.C. 5:23-2.23(c) shall be \$200.
- (d) The fee for the first issuance and the renewal of a temporary certificate of occupancy shall be \$30.
 - (1) Exception: There shall be no fee for the first issuance of the temporary certificate of occupancy provided the certificate of occupancy fee is paid at that time.
 - (2) Exception: Where a written request for a temporary certificate of occupancy is made for reasons other than uncompleted work covered by the permit (such as uncompleted work required by prior approvals from State or municipal agencies), no renewal fee shall be charged.

7. Variations.

The fee for an application for a variation in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:23-2.10 shall be \$748 for class I structures, \$151. for class II structures and \$75 for class III structures. The fee for resubmission of an application for a variation shall be \$289 for class I structures and \$82 for class II structures and \$50 for class III structures.

8. Annual Permits.

The fee to be charged for an annual construction permit shall be charged annually. This fee shall be a flat fee based upon the number of maintenance workers who are employed by the facility, and who are primarily engaged in work that is governed by a subcode. Managers, engineers and clericals shall not be considered maintenance workers for the purpose of establishing the annual construction permit fee. Annual permits may be issued for building/fire protection, electrical and plumbing.

Fees for annual permits shall be as follows:

- (a) One to 25 workers (including foremen) \$840/worker; each additional worker over 25, \$292/worker.
- (b) Prior to the issuance of the annual permit, a training registration fee of \$176 per subcode and a list of not more than three individuals to be trained per subcode shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department of Community Affairs, Bureau of Code Services, Education Unit along with a copy of the construction permit (Form F170). Checks shall be made payable to "Treasurer, State of New Jersey." The Department shall register these individuals and notify them of the courses being offered.



ORDINANCE 2023-07

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 3 SECTION 25.3 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "PARKING OF BUSES AND TRUCKS", and CHAPTER 7, SECTION 15 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "PARKING OF VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF FOUR TONS PROHIBITED"

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Lake Como, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"), a public body corporate and politic of State of New Jersey ("the State"), wish to amend and supplement the ordinance prohibiting parking of certain trucks, vehicles and trailers for greater clarity to the Borough and its residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake Como, Chapter 3 Section 25.3 is hereby amended and supplemented as follows (additions in [brackets]; deletions stuck through):

§3-25.3 PARKING OF BUSES AND TRUCKS.

There shall be no parking of any of the following vehicles on the public streets or any parts thereof or any public property within the Borough of Lake Como during the hours of 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.:

- a. Any commercially licensed vehicle;
- b. Any bus, omnibus, house trailer, camper, recreational vehicle, boat, boat trailer;
- c. Any box truck (which shall mean any vehicle with a separate cab and box-type structure); and
- d. Any vehicle over 10,000 pounds.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lake Como, Chapter 7 Section 15 is hereby amended and supplemented as follows (additions in [brackets]; deletions struck through):

§ 7-15. PARKING OF VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF FOUR TONS PROHIBITED [CERTAIN TRUCKS, VEHICLES AND TRAILERS PROHIBITED].

No person shall park a truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or omnibus having registered gross weights in excess of four tons upon any street between the hours specified.

Section a. No person shall park any commercially licensed vehicle, a school bus, box trucks (which shall mean any vehicle with a separate cab and box-type structure) any type of bus, recreational vehicle, camper, boat or trailer, however not including six-wheel pickup trucks or trucks utilized for the purpose of making deliveries or moving furniture,

and not including any vehicle with handicap license plates or properly issued and displayed handicap placard, between the hours specified, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described.

WITNESSETH:

RECITALS

- 1. The Authority has entered into Service Agreement Addendum Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 to Service Agreement with Member Municipality.
- 2. The Authority and Member Municipality are desirous of amending the Service Agreement by 1) amending the calculation and certification of annual payments and 2) extend the duration of the contract for an additional thirty (30 years) by the Authority and the Member Municipality as adopted by the Authority pursuant to Addendum No. 5 of the Service Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto for and in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, hereby agree to and with each other, each intending to be legally bound, as follows:

- A. Anything to the contrary notwithstanding contained in the original Service Agreement and Addendum Nos. 1, 2 3 and 4 between the Authority and the Member Municipality, the provision; in the within Addendum No. 5 Agreement shall control and be binding upon the parties.
- B. Section 2.06: Calculation and Certification of Annual Payments This section is hereby modified to read as follows:

On or before the 15th of December of the preceding year, in any year in which the Authority shall calculate a rate or rates as herein above provided, the Authority shall calculate and certify to municipalities the amount of money which each shall be required to pay to the Authority during the ensuing year. As to each municipality, such amount shall be calculated by the Authority by applying said

rate or rates (including any applicable surcharges as provided herein) to the volume and characteristics of the sewerage delivered and discharged into the Authority facilities by each municipality, during the full year ending on the last day of September next preceding as shown in the records of the Authority or, if there is no record covering such delivery and discharge during full stated flow year. Then to the volume of sewerage (if any) which the Authority then estimates will be delivered and discharged by each municipality into the Authority facilities during the first full year of operation of the Authority facilities.

All remaining paragraphs of this Section of the Service Agreement remain in effect.

C Section 3.08: Duration of Contract –This section is hereby amended to read as follows:

This Agreement shall become effective upon its execution by the Authority and all of the Member Municipalities as set forth in Section 3.06 and the term thereof shall extend until March 31, 2054 and thereafter until terminated by either party upon two years' notice to the other party; provided however, that in no event shall this Agreement be terminated prior to the payment in full of all obligations of the Authority including its bonds.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH AND THE BOROUGH OF LAKE COMO FOR THE PROVISION OF LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Health, through the Monmouth County Health Department (the "County"), provides State mandated local health services pursuant to the Local Health Services Act, N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-1 et seq. and the Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Boards of Health in New Jersey, N.J.A.C. 8:52-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, there must be a Board of Health in every municipality in the State, whether through its own individual municipal local health agency or through another agency such as a county health department; and

WHEREAS, the County serves as the health department for various towns throughout Monmouth County by virtue of contractual agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Lake Como (the "Municipality") is in need of the provision of local health services, and the County desires to provide these health services to the Municipality.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the County and the Municipality (collectively the "Parties") agree as follows:

A. ADMINISTRATION.

- 1. The County hereby accepts the Municipality as a member in the Monmouth County Board of Health system effective January 1, 2023. The County agrees to provide the Municipality with any and all current and future State mandated public health services required by statute, law, code regulation and/or directive which shall satisfy any and all health service obligations of the Municipality. The County further agrees that its employees, agents, and servants shall provide all aforesaid services in an efficient, timely manner.
- 2. The County's Health Department is designated as the statutorily recognized local health agency for the Municipality.
- 3. The County's Public Health Coordinator is designated as the full-time health officer for the Municipality for all public health services and activities.
- 4. The Public Health Coordinator shall provide technical and professional services to assure the provision of core public health services, along with any elected services, that meet the standards set forth in the Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Boards of Health in New Jersey, *N.J.A.C.* 8:52-1 et seq.
- 5. The Public Health Coordinator shall assess public health needs, plan, organize and implement public health activities within the Municipality.

- 6. The Public Health Coordinator shall lead the investigation of, and response to, all public health emergencies, disasters and/or hazardous situations within the Municipality.
- 7. To fulfill the requirements of core public health activities, along with elected activities, the County may designate qualified and experienced representatives to assume responsibility for delegated activities as may be required, necessary and/or prudent to carry out and discharge public health activities.
- 8. The Public Health Coordinator may delegate activities to customary personnel, such as nurses, registered environmental health specialists, health educators and any others as may be required to carry out core activities. Personnel that have been delegated activities shall satisfy the requirements set forth in NJ.A.C. 8:52-1 et seq. and NJ.A.C. 8:7-1 et seq., regarding licensure of persons for public health positions.
- **B. COST**. As per *N.J.S.A*. 26:3A2-19, payment by the Municipality to the County shall be determined based upon the County's annual budget adopted by the County Board of County Commissioners. The County Board of Taxation shall adjust and apportion the annual levy between participating municipalities in accordance with *N.J.S.A*. 54:4-49. The total amount will be assessed, levied and collected in the same manner and at the same time as other County taxes. Such cost also includes the provision of public health nursing services. There shall be no surcharges for legal fees, overtime or emergency events.
- C. TERM. This Agreement shall be in effect for a five (5) year period commencing January 1, 2023. After participation for not less than two (2) years, the Municipality may withdraw from this Agreement, provided that the Municipality gives the County a minimum of six (6) months' notice in accordance with N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-12. This Agreement shall run on a calendar year basis, therefore notice of termination must be given by no later than July 1st in order to be effective for the following January 1st.
- D. INDEMNIFICATION. The Municipality hereby agrees to indemnify and hold the County harmless at all times in respect to all liabilities in connection with any and all past, present and future claims, actions, proceedings, judgments or expenses arising from any and all health services provided by the Municipality, its employees, and/or the Monmouth County Regional Health Commission #1 [prior health services provider] at any time prior to the effective date of the within Agreement. The Municipality further agrees to indemnify, protect, and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all suits, claims, demands, or damages, arising out of any act, error, or omission of the Municipality, its employees, or its agents, including but not limited to expenditures for investigation, legal defense, judgments, and/or settlements.
- E. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW. The Parties agree that the services covered by this Agreement shall be provided in full compliance with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations, including but not necessarily limited to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), as amended and implemented. The Parties agree to execute such other documents as may be needed to ensure full legal compliance.

- F. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE AGREEMENT. The execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized by the governing bodies of the County and the Municipality.
- G. CHOICE OF LAW. This Agreement shall be governed by and be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey. All disputes arising under this Contract shall be resolved exclusively in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Monmouth County.
- H. COUNTERPARTS. This Agreement may be fully executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement binding upon all parties, notwithstanding that all parties have not signed the same counterpart. Such executions may be transmitted to the parties electronically or by facsimile, and such electronic or facsimile execution shall have the same force and effect as an original signature.
- I. COPY. Upon execution, this Agreement shall be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Health, Office of Local Public Health, P.O. Box 360, Trenton, NJ 08625-0360.
- J. NOTICES. Any notices that are required pursuant to this Agreement shall be made in writing (including facsimile and electronic transmissions), and mailed or transmitted or delivered as follows:
